



44. $y(\sin x) + y(\cos x) = a.$

Solution in implicit form:

$$y(\sin x) = \frac{1}{2}a + \Phi(\sin x, \cos x),$$

where $\Phi(x, z) = -\Phi(z, x)$ is any antisymmetric function of two arguments.
