$$12. \quad F_1\left(x, \frac{1}{w} \frac{\partial w}{\partial x}\right) + w^k F_2\left(y, \frac{1}{w} \frac{\partial w}{\partial y}\right) = 0.$$

Complete integral:

$$w(x, y) = \varphi(x)\psi(y).$$

The functions $\varphi = \varphi(x)$ and $\psi = \psi(y)$ are determined by solving the ordinary differential equations

$$\varphi^{-k} F_1\left(x, \varphi'_x/\varphi\right) = C, \quad \psi^k F_2\left(y, \psi'_y/\psi\right) = -C,$$

where C is an arbitrary constant.
